INFORMATION WANTED



JANE DOE #25, FW/18-23, small build, 100 to 120 pounds, mid-back length brown hair with blond traces near scalp, plucked eyebrows, brown eyes, a one inch vertical scar three inches below right kneecap. She has a full silver cap on left upper first molar with lower right front molar missing for some time.

On April 11, 1976, the victim was discovered on Lopez Canyon Road, San Fernando, a remote canyon area in Los Angeles County. She was wearing tan multi-colored print blouse with rust colored tree figures, long sleeves with elastic cuffs, worn midriff style, size medium, labeled "styled in California", no brassier found, purple bell-bottom trousers with two inch wide cuffs, with two metal snaps and zipper in front, labeled "male," made in USA. She was also wearing light green panties with "Thursday" embroidered in darker green stitching, black clog shoes with heavy leather straps, four inch high solid heels with 3/4 inch crepe soles.

Found near the victim was a brown cotton suede jacket with white wool collar and cuffs, labeled "Londontown by Checkpoint," second label marked RN504858 made in Taiwan. There was no jewelry or tattoos. Unknown cause of death due to the victim's condition. Dental chart available
